

The UU Multiracial Unity Action Council (uumuac.org) has published a book by its founder, a black man born in the South, a near-contemporary of MLK, who was ordained a Baptist minister but after discovering Unitarian Universalism became a longtime member of the First Unitarian Church of Chicago.

This book explains the development, starting around 1970, of a new form of racism to replace the Jim Crow system used in the South and the system of de-facto segregation used in much of the rest of the United States, plus how that system has evolved in the 21st century. The author also explains the failure of the so-called "antiracism" of the UUA, the UU Ministers Association, and the UU seminaries, and describes an alternative that he calls Multiracial Unitarian Universalism.
